## MiGreat!



The first intellectual output of the project is ready! The “CVET Case Study and extended Needs Analysis” identifies the needs of job agencies, migrant organisations and training organisations in assessing the needs of migrants and refugees in connection with CVET (Continuous Vocational Education and Training) and APL (Accreditation of Prior Learning), in the participating countries: Austria (AT), Greece (EL), Italy (IT), Switzerland (CH), Sweden (SE) and the United Kingdom (UK).

As different sectors are significant for the labour market development and dynamics in each country, the local research was conducted with a focus on the following sectors: Agriculture (CH, IT), Construction (IT), Health (SE, UK), Retail (AT, CH), Services (SE, UK), Textile (IT) and Tourism (AT, EL).

A set of needs and recommendations have been identified to support the development of the MiGreat! training modules.

Work is also ongoing for the MiGreat app aimed to support migrants in managing a new career in a hosting country. The app will help migrants get a basic understanding of the local culture and what it is like to work and study there. It will provide migrants with tools to make the right career choice and help understand personal strengths. It will also help explore the world of work in the new country and provide tools and activities to help strengthen networking opportunities.

MiGreat! project is an Erasmus+ project (2016-2018) which aims at developing training procedures and tools to support training and employability of migrants in partner countries. The project aims to improve the skills of VETPROs working with immigrants, migrant workers and refugees.

The main project’s target group consists in VETPROs working with immigrants. The secondary target group includes people with migrant background, migrant workers and refugees.


